Dear Colleague.

As per the curriculum of BSc. Nursing & GNM courses as approved by Indian Nursing Council (INC), it is mandatory for the students to undergo field training at Urban Health Facility for a duration of 7weeks(49 days) & 8 weeks(63days) respectively. This additional human resource in the form of Nursing students and faculties can be tapped to support NUHM. This will not only supplement the programme but will also equip them with skills & knowledge in Urban Health.

Human resource is a very critical aspect for the effective implementation of the program. In the current scenario there is a shortage of human resource especially of nursing personnel under NUHM.

At present there are 1752 institutions both govt. and private recognised by INC conducting BSc. Nursing course with capacity of 88211 seats and 3040 institutions conducting GNM course with 122017 seats.

Break up for Urban Community experience during BSc Nursing and GNM are as follows- GNM (3 year course including Internship) – First year – 4 weeks, third year 2 weeks and Internship 3 weeks-63 days-384 man hours/student-Total 4,68,54,528 man hours.

BSc Nursing (4 year course including Internship) – Second year 2 weeks, fourth year 1 week and Internship 4 weeks-49 days-289 man hours/student-Total 2,54,92,979 man hours.

The main objectives of the training are:

- Assess health needs of family and community, Plan and carry out treatment for minor ailments and refer.
- Participate in School Health Program and National Health Programs.
- Organise group for self-help and involve clients in their own health activities.

- Provide Primary health care including MCH and family welfare services.
- Counsel and educate individual, family and community on nutrition, hygiene, selfhealth monitoring, seeking health services, healthy life style, family welfare methods and health promotion.
- Collect vital health statistics and maintain Records & reports.

Also please find enclosed the objectives of the urban postings as per the guidelines of the INC, details of State Nursing Councils, and number of institutions and seats available within your state for ready reference.

You may co-ordinate the allocation of urban health facilities to the nursing institutions within your State/UTs with support from respective State/UT nursing councils. State Nodal Officer for NUHM may be designated as a single point of contact for collaborating institutions so that these resources which are expected to be available without any cost to the Govt. shall be optimally utilised.
